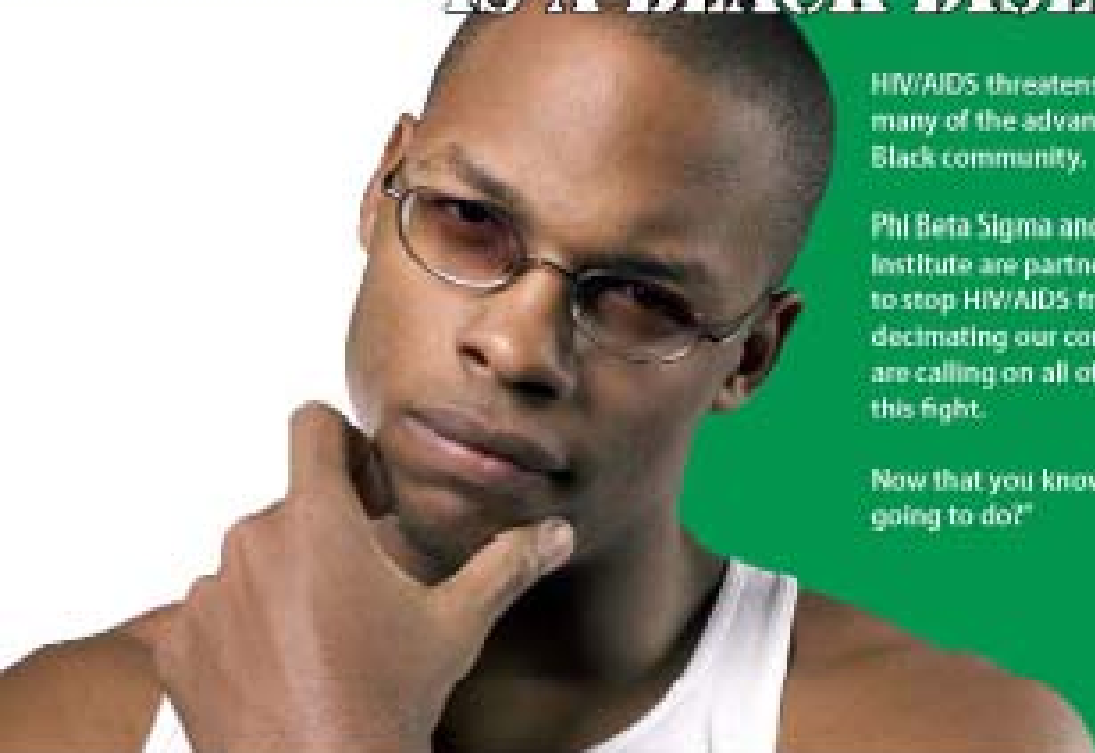


AIDS IS A BLACK DISEASE.



HIV/AIDS threatens to undermine many of the advances made in the Black community.

Phi Beta Sigma and the Black AIDS Institute are partnering together to stop HIV/AIDS from further decimating our communities. We are calling on all of brothers to join this fight.

Now that you know what are you going to do?*

■ African Americans comprise only 13 percent of the U.S. population, but account for nearly 50 percent of the 56,000 estimated new HIV/AIDS cases and over half of those who die from AIDS each year.

■ If Black America were a country unto itself, it would have more people living with HIV/AIDS than Guyana, Rwanda, Haiti, Namibia, Vietnam, Botswana and Ethiopia.

■ HIV was the fourth leading cause of death for Black men in 2004, ranking higher than for their respective counterparts in any other racial/ethnic group. In 2004, Black men had the highest HIV death rate per 100,000 men aged 25-44 at 383; it was 5.5 for white men.

BE 1 IN A MILLION. GET TESTED FOR HIV.

Although HIV testing has been made simpler, faster, and more accessible, many people remain in the dark about their HIV status. The Black AIDS Institute's Test 1 Million campaign is a call-to-action for 1 million Black Americans to get tested for HIV.
